## "Intermarried," by Yael Ben-Zion (Kehrer, \$50)

What does it mean to be intermarried in 2014? Photographer Yael Ben-Zion let her subjects decide, asking couples in Manhattan who defined their own relationships as "mixed" to invite her into their homes. Turns out that covers race, religion, social class and an ever-expanding geography. One couple is half Ethiopian, half Nepali. Ben-Zion's photos skip the obvious, documenting the evidence that truly defines the mix: Books, photos, kids, art, knick-knacks. Each shot enriched by a quote from its subjects.
